La Jolla group counter sues city for independence

LA JOLLA – A nonprofit group clued La Jolla residents on Sept. 2 on the city’s lawsuit attempting to thwart its ongoing incorporation drive.

The Association for the City of La Jolla (ACLJ) told residents at a public meeting that they’ve filed a counteraction seeking to have the city’s suit voided. That legal action, known as an anti-Strategic Lawsuit Against Public Participation (SLAPP) motion, was taken in response to a lawsuit brought by the city against the San Diego County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO), a state agency regulating the creation, expansion, and reorganization of local government agencies.

Grassroots ACLJ’s anti-SLAPP motion argues that the city’s lawsuit is “a meritless attempt to obstruct democratic participation and silence a public-interest effort through costly litigation.”

The city has amended its lawsuit challenging the ongoing effort to detach La

Jolla from San Diego. The city is maintaining that a regional agency’s plans to proceed with the incorporation review process would impose “substantial irreparable harm” on it due to costs associated with city staff time required to

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# Find your NFL team bar in Pacific Beach, Mission Beach, and La Jolla

SAN DIEGO – The National Football League is back, and there are plenty of sports bars along the waterfront in Pacific Beach, Mission Beach, and La Jolla to choose from for fans to grab a bite or a brew and cheer on their favorite teams.

Here are just a few of the many local spots in Pacific Beach and Mission Beach that are haunts for some of the NFL's 32 teams:

In Pacific Beach, Duck Dive at 4650 Mission Blvd. offers an impressive lineup of game-time food and drink specials. Mavericks Beach Club at 860 Garnet Ave. offers 40 TVs in its five indoor/outdoor bars, so you won't miss a moment of action this season. Look to the Local PB, 809 Thomas Ave., for supporting specific teams like the Buffalo Bills. Tavern at the Beach at 1200 Garnet Ave. is known for showing all 32 NFL teams on 42 HD TVs.

In Mission Beach, Sandbar Sportsbar & Grill at 718 Ventura Place has TVs strategically placed downstairs, as well as on the SkyDeck for NFL viewing. Miss B's Coconut Club at 3704 Mission Blvd. is now a certified Packers bar and shows all Green Bay games on both indoor and outdoor TVs. They've even posted on their Instagram welcoming all "cheeseheads." Guava Beach Bar & Grill at 3714 Mission Blvd. is a known spot for Vikings fans.

In La Jolla, The Spot La Jolla, 1005 Prospect St., and Nautilus Tavern, 6830 La Jolla Blvd., are good NFL football-viewing options.

Generally, most bars show NFL games, but specific "team bars" may be harder to confirm without visiting or checking their social media during the NFL season. If you have a particular team you follow, contacting the bar directly to inquire
